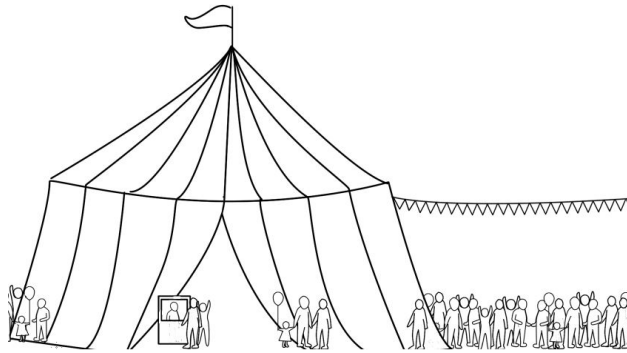


## Joining National Celebration or Festival
