

## Ordering Breakfast

<b>scramble</b> [skræmbəl] verb past tense: scrambled	I made scrambled eggs for breakfast.
<b>grits</b> [grɪts] noun	Grits and gravy was served in the cafeteria.
<b>choice</b> [choɪs] noun	Every decision faces a choice.
<b>recap</b> [rɪˈkæp] verb	The waitress recapped our order.
